penalty, as aforesaid, to file a copy of the paper or proceeding by which the same was commenced within such time as the court may determine; and in default thereof the court shall dismiss the said action or proceeding; but if said order shall be complied with, then said district court shall require the other party to plead, and said action or proceeding shall proceed to final judgment. The said district court may make an order requiring the parties thereto to plead de novo; and the bond given, conditioned as aforesaid, shall be discharged so far as it requires copy of the record to be filed as aforesaid.

Mr. MOON of Pennsylvania. Mr. Speaker, at this time I desire to offer the following amendment, which is necessary because of the act passed since this bill was reported, the provisions of which have already been carried into the bill.

The Clerk read as follows:
Section 39, on page 33, strike out all of lines 4 to 11, inclusive, and begin the first word of line 12 with a small "1."
